




ABOUT THE STORY...

In the end, the narrator relents and eats the green eggs and ham and ends up loving the food.




THE BIG GUY

FRIENDSHIP

- Are Sam and the big guy friends?
 Yes, sir. They go on adventures together and share their food. If that's not friendship, I don't know what is.
- Why doesn't the big guy want to eat the green eggs and ham?
 Maybe he's never seen green eggs and ham before. Would you want to eat purple macaroni and cheese?
 - What kind of creature is Sam?



EXPLORATION

"Would you? Could you? In a car? Eat them! Eat them!Here they are." (LINES 50-53)

When Sam kidnaps the big guy in his car, things get pretty intense. See, the big guy doesn't want to explore anything; he just wants to chill at home reading his papers. Like you do. But sometimes life forces you to explore new things.



Think About It

- 1. Is it fair of Sam-I-Am to keep pestering the narrator to try green eggs and ham? Should he have left him alone after the first time the narrator said he does not like green eggs and ham?
- 2. At the end of the book, the narrator declares he likes green eggs and ham after trying them. Is it okay to change your mind about something?


