


The Tale of Peter Rabbit

Summary of this story

The book introduces Peter Rabbit, who is far more adventurous than his siblings: Flopsy, Mopsy, and Cotton-tail. Before going to the baker's, their mother warns them to avoid Mr. McGregor's garden, because their father had an "accident" there and ended up in a pie. However, after she leaves, the naughty Peter immediately squeezes under the garden gate to gorge on Mr. McGregor's vegetables, while the others obediently go up the lane to pick blackberries. Mr. McGregor soon spots Peter near the cucumber frame and chases the terrified young rabbit all over the garden, and Peter loses both his shoes and his little blue jacket. After finally locating the gate, Peter returns home frightened but a little wiser. Mrs. Rabbit gives Peter chamomile tea, but, for his good siblings, she produces a supper of bread and milk and blackberries.



Peter Rabbit lived with his mother and his sisters "underneath the root of a very big fir-tree". Who was NOT one of his sisters?

- A. Flopsy
- B. Topsy
- C. Mopsy
- D. Cotton-tail

The correct answer was Topsy

Everyone in Peter's family was a brown rabbit with a white tail. Mrs. Rabbit dressed her daughters in red coats and Peter in a blue jacket.



While Mrs. Rabbit was out, Peter's sisters, "who were good little bunnies, went down the lane" and gathered which treat?

A. blackberries

B. currant buns

C. carrots

D. lettuce leaves

The correct answer was blackberries

Before Mrs. Rabbit went out to the baker's she told her children that they could play in the fields and the lane, but NOT in Mr. McGregor's garden. Peter's sisters were "good little bunnies" and got to eat their blackberries for supper.



Peter, "who was very naughty, ran straight to Mr. McGregor's garden". What were the first things he ate when he got there?

- A. parsley and peas
- B. cabbages
- C. cucumbers
- D. lettuces, French beans, and radishes

The correct answer was lettuces, French beans, and radishes
In the illustration, Peter looked absolutely delighted to be stuffing himself with
Mr. McGregor's vegetables.



After Peter's feast, Mr. McGregor spotted him. What did the farmer cry out?

- A. "Get out of my garden!"
- B. "Stop thief!"
- C. "I'll put you in a pie!"
- D. "Shoo!"

The correct answer was "Stop thief!"

When Mr. McGregor saw Peter he chased after him with a rake, and for a moment it seemed as though Peter might be baked in a pie, like his father.



Peter had almost escaped from the garden but his jacket got caught in a gooseberry net. Who helped him get out of this pickle?

- A. some friendly sparrows
- B. his mother
- C. his sisters
- D. Mrs. McGregor

The correct answer was some friendly sparrows

Although there are birds in a number of the illustrations, this is the only time any of them actually helped Peter.



Peter escaped from Mr. McGregor by running into the tool-shed. Where did he hide? (Maybe this wasn't the best choice he could have made).

- A. in a watering can full of water
- B. under a flower pot
- C. in an empty watering can
- D. behind a sieve

The correct answer was in a watering can full of water A watering can might have been a nice place to hide, but the water made Peter sneeze, "kertyschoo", and so Mr. McGregor discovered him.



After escaping from the shed, how did Peter find his way out of the garden?

- A. An old mouse told him where to go.
- B. He found a hole in the fence.
- C. A white cat chased him to the gate.
- D. He climbed onto a wheelbarrow and saw the gate.

The correct answer was He climbed onto a wheelbarrow and saw the gate.

Wet and unsure where to go, Peter hopped, "lippity-lippity", around the garden. He met a mouse and a cat, but he eventually had to find the gate himself.



What happened to the little blue jacket Peter lost in the gooseberry net?

A. The sparrows returned it to him.

B. Mr. McGregor used it to make a scarecrow.

C. His mother got it back for him.

D. Mrs. McGregor gave it to the needy orphans.

The correct answer was Mr. McGregor used it to make a scarecrow.

Peter lost two shoes as well as his jacket, and Mr. McGregor used all of these to make a scarecrow.



When Peter finally made it home, why was his mother cross with him?

A. He was dirty.

B. He had injured his paw.

C. He had lost his clothes.

D. He was late.

The correct answer was He had lost his clothes.

Not only had Peter lost his clothes, it was the second time he had done this in two weeks!



Peter's sisters ate the treats they had collected for supper, but what did Peter have?

- A. bread and water
- B. three lettuce leaves
- C. one carrot
- D. chamomile tea

The correct answer was chamomile tea

Flopsy, Mopsy and Cotton-tail looked as if they enjoyed the blackberries, but I'm sure the tea was very good for Peter, wet and exhausted as he was.
